HOW TO REACH BOSTON HILLS PET MEMORIAL PARK

From Akron: Drive north on Route 8, turning **right** at traffic light onto Hines Hill Road, which you will see at the **BROWN DERBY INN** (500 feet past the Ohio Turnpike overpass.) Continue on Hines Hill for about ½ mile; then turn left onto Walters Road. Cemetery is on right about a quarter-mile farther.

From Cleveland: Drive south on Route 8, turning **left** onto Hines Hill Road at **BROWN DERBY INN**. Directions from that point are identical with the above instructions.

From Ohio Turnpike: Exit at gate 12 and proceed **north** (toward Cleveland) on Route 8 about 500 feet only. Turn right onto Hines Hill Road at **BROWN DERBY INN**. Pick up instructions from the "Akron" directions above, and follow to the memorial park. Visit our modern animal funeral home

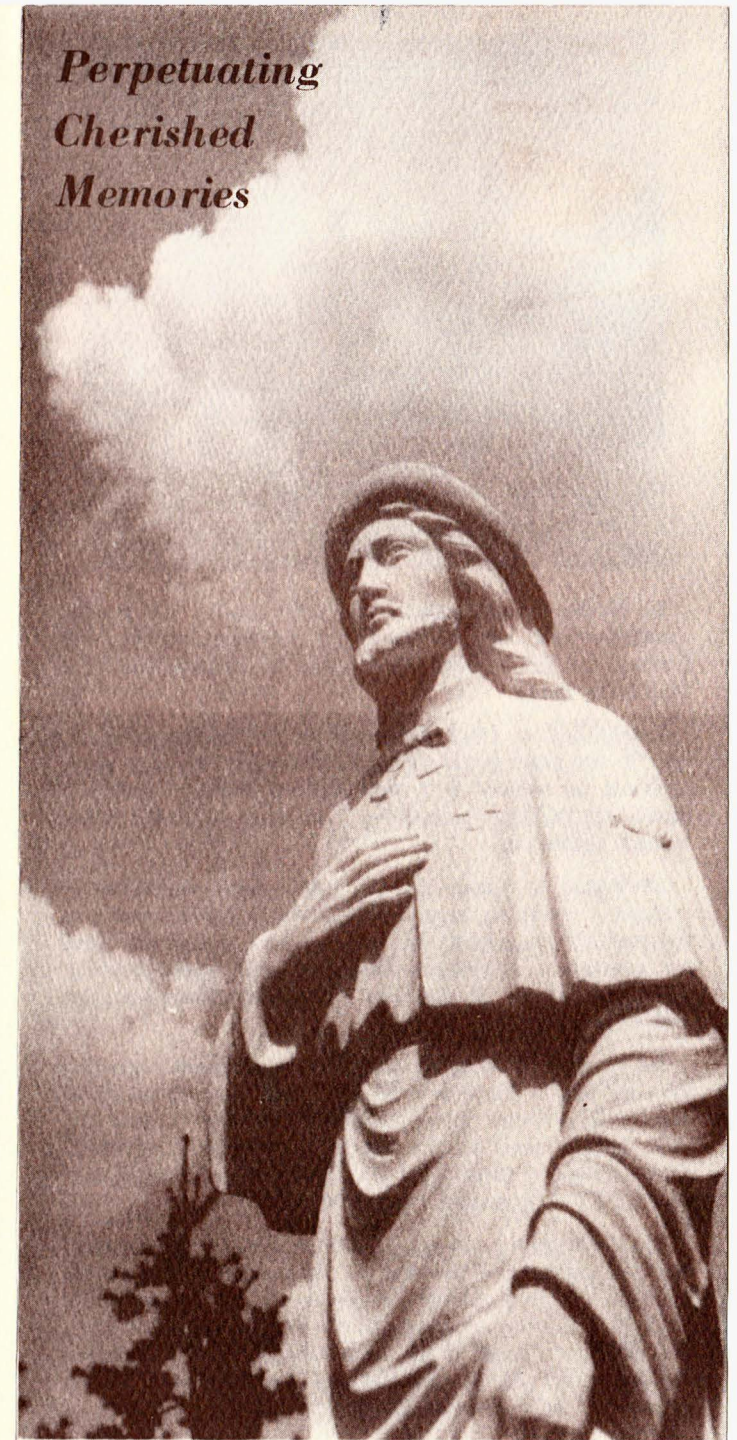

In placid repose, tucked discreetly among the waving meadows and serene woods of northeastern Summit County, lie the sun-spangled lawns of Boston Hills Pet Memorial Park.

Established in 1945, Boston Hills Pet Memorial Park, now in the third generation of one-family care and management, is subject to a personalized concern and perpetual maintenance exceeding even that accorded some human cemeteries.

Dedicated to preserving the many fond memories of mutually rewarding experiences between master and pet, the park's management has adopted and always practiced the concept of serving with dignity and understanding, vowing never to go the way of over-commercialization and exploitation.

Pet owners wishing to have peace of mind regarding the final resting place of their loyal pets are encouraged to inquire in advance about Boston Hills, and to visit the park. Some twenty acres comprise the cemetery, of which only a few are already in use. Therefore, space for projected future expansion is plentiful.

By investigating the park's "Prior Planning Program," you will understand the wisdom of making arrangements for burial of your pet now, while not under the inevitable pressure and stress which make the determination of plans and details difficult, if not impossible. Your veterinarian will cooperate. Please call the park and talk with one of the authorized personnel for full details.

General Policies, Facilities, and Regulations

BURIALS — A minimum charge includes cost of a sturdy pine box (painted inside and out), burial plot, and concrete number marker, but deluxe fiberglass pet caskets and vaults are also available. A specified time of burial is set. Your attendance is encouraged but optional. Burial services are conducted with respect and dignity.

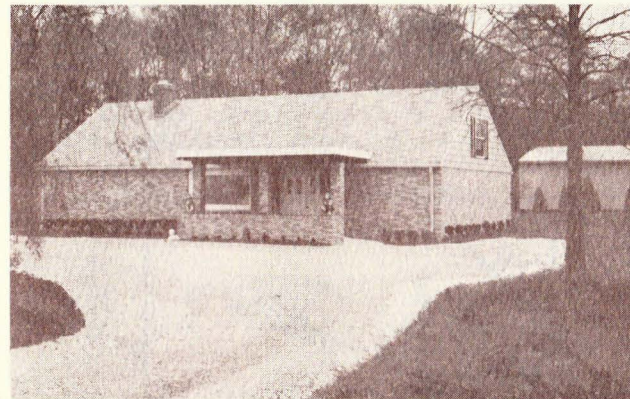
CREMATION, EMBALMING — Both of these services are available.

Facilities are also available for lawn burial of ashes. Please call the park and talk with one of the authorized personnel for full details.

FEE CONTINGENCIES — Costs for all burials depend ultimately on size of the pet, location of lot, type of casket, the type of marker you specify, and such other possible deviations from the standard procedure in the services as you might request. Cremations or embalming, available as stated above, also would differ in price from standard burials.

PRIOR PLANNING — Advance planning, done with leisurely, rational deliberation, is wise. If you choose to prepay, you will defeat the inflationary increases that future years could bring. Please call the park and talk with one of the authorized personnel for full details. A prior planning and maintenance trust fund has been established. You are encouraged to inquire about this.

CALL SERVICE — Ambulance pickup service for deceased pets is available at a nominal fee determined by distance.

Open Mon. thru Fri. from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
Sat. 9 a.m. to Noon — BY APPOINTMENT ONLY

MARKERS — Four types of markers are allowed. A (round) concrete **number marker**, bearing your lot number, is included with every burial. It is placed flush with the ground. A 9-inch by 6-inch permanent **concrete marker**, bearing both the pet's name and owner's name, is available at slight extra charge. It, too, is placed flush with the ground. **Granite markers** for flush placement can be ordered (offered by the cemetery), with inscription according to your wishes. These may be of varying dimensions. **Upright markers** are also offered through the cemetery. If specifications are approved by the cemetery management in advance, **special markers** or monuments may be obtained. **All** such upright monuments require a six-inch base or foundation border of concrete for maintenance purposes. Be sure to consult with park management when considering choice of a marker.

VISITATION AT CEMETERY — Although visitors are welcome every day, Sunday is "official" visitors' day at the memorial park. (There are no Sunday burials.) Walkways are in, and the area is illuminated at night.

FLOWERS — When plants or flowers (artificial or live) have become withered or "weatherbeaten," they will be removed by the management. Approved floral vases which do not interfere with mowing may be purchased at the office. A water pump is located in the park for your convenience. **Pinwheels not permitted.**

FENCES — Since lot fences interfere with proper maintenance, they are not permitted in the park.

WINTER BLANKETS — Winter blankets of verdant green are available through the cemetery and are highly recommended. Placed on graves about Thanksgiving and left to remain until approximately spring, they provide some needed contrast against the snow and keep the grave attractive during this period of inclement weather.

PLAQUES — Using a photograph or drawing of your beloved pet, it is now possible to order a handsome, prestigious-looking engraved metal plaque bearing this likeness, which is inset into the surface of a concrete upright monument. These attractive personal touches are available through the cemetery at a surprisingly low cost.

REMEMBRANCE LITES — Warmly glowing remembrance candles are also available at the park. They burn for approximately 120 hours, and are customarily lit for special seasons of the year. If you live far away, a telephone call can arrange to have one placed on your pet's grave.

PROJECTED PARK PLANS — It is the policy of the management to put a majority of the proceeds from park services back into the park in a continuous program of upgrading and refining its facilities and services. Additional landscaping is also to be done. A modern animal funeral home, office facilities, have been completed.
