

Over 200 Enter Projects In Science Fair

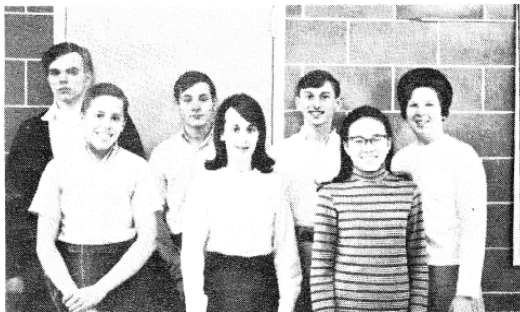
The Senior High School cafeteria on Friday, March 8, was THE scene for Garfield's young scientists and mathematicians. Over two hundred projects, the work of students enrolled in biology, chemistry, physics, and advanced biology, were on display in the school's annual science fair. This night climaxed the work of the students and the sweat of the science and math teachers who had to grade each project.

A total of nine superior ratings were awarded this year with three in science and six in mathematics. Richard Zadnik and Robert Marks earned theirs in physics, Marilyn Miles (who recently transferred to Solon)—in biology, and Mike Somos, John Sender, Ed Hardisky, Tina Iyama, Barbara Bartels, and Marilyn Dunk—in mathematics. Twenty-five excellent, fifty-three good, and over one hundred satisfactory ratings were given to the rest of the projects.

Admission was charged to get into the cafeteria. The tickets cost

fifteen cents in advance and twenty-five cents at the door. Over one hundred dollars was collected for use by the science and math departments.
